He then moved to Charlotte in a medical education position with Carolinas Healthcare System but moved back to Durham in 2012. While mostly retired since 2008 he continues to do some part time consulting and teaching.</p> <p>He began growing orchids in 1980, initially purely as a hobbyist, ultimately growing his collection to a small commercial backyard operation with 3500 plants. He was very active in Triangle Orchid Society and worked with Jack Webster and other members of Triangle to host an AOS/EOC meeting in Raleigh in 1993. Upon moving to Charlotte in 1994 he downsized to approximately 1200 plants in an 800 square foot greenhouse and was an active member of NCPOS. He has been a member of the NC Piedmont OS, Triangle OS, and South Carolina OS, a member of AOS since 1980, entered the AOS judging program in 1991, has chaired the Carolinas Judging Center, served as AOS judges' training coordinator, AOS Trustee from 2004-2010 and 2013-16, and as Chair of the Judging Committee of AOS from 2010-14. He recently left the board but continues to serve as an Honorary Vice President and chair of the AOS Development Committee and is Vice President and program chair for Triangle.</p> <p>His plants have received 52 AOS awards and 3 of his own hybrids have been recognized with AOS awards. His collection consists primarily of Cattleyas and Dendrobiums. He has named three hybrids which have received AOS awards: Rlc. Lisa Taylor Gallis, C. Susie's Valentine and Rct. Georgia Peach.</p> <p>Recently three of his own hybrids have received AOS awards: Den. Alex Gallis, Den. Sara Gallis and Rct. Savannah Hope Gallis. His favorite plants are midsize and miniature Cattleyas and big and tall antelope Dendrobiums which he grows in a 300 square foot greenhouse.</p> <p>Harry's program will recount his experiences traveling to Taiwan with a group of AOS judges to judge the Taiwan International Orchid Show in 2012.</p>
